**Consumer Health Data Privacy Policy**

**Effective date:** January 23, 2026

This Consumer Health Data Privacy Policy ("**Policy**") applies to the Consumer Health Data of residents of the Washington, Connecticut and Nevada that Pathos collects, uses, or shares, including when you visit use our Services. Please read this Policy carefully. **This Policy applies solely to Washington, Connecticut, and Nevada consumers. Please see our [Privacy Policy](#) for general information about how we collect, use, and share Personal Information.**

**1. What is Consumer Health Data**

“**Consumer Health Data**” means Personal Information that is linked or reasonably linkable to a consumer and that identifies the consumer's past, present, or future physical or mental health status, which may include information about your relationship with us, given the nature of our services. Consumer Health Data does not include information that is publicly available, De-Identified Data, or Aggregated Data.

**2. Categories of Consumer Health Data We Collect**

We collect Consumer Health Data directly from you when you use our AI therapy services. We create a transcript of your AI therapy sessions, including any information you provide to us during your AI therapy sessions.

We may collect Consumer Health Data, such as Cookies, online identifiers, Internet, browser, device or other electronic network activity information. For more information about the types of Internet and network activity information we collect, please see our [Privacy Policy](#).

**3. Categories of Sources of Consumer Health Data**

We collect Consumer Health Data, directly from you when you participate in an AI therapy session. Additionally, we may collect Consumer Health Data about you from our analytics providers, third-party advertising partners when you visit the Website and Platform.

**4. Our Purposes for Collecting and Using Consumer Health Data**

Our primary purpose for collecting your Consumer Health Data is to provide you with your AI therapy sessions. We may collect, use, disclose, or otherwise process your Consumer Health Data as reasonably necessary to improve our Services.

With your explicit consent, we will collect your Consumer Health Data on the Site for targeted advertising purposes.

**5. Aggregated and De-Identified Data**

We may create Aggregated Data and De-Identified Data from Consumer Health Data. “**De-Identified Data**” is individual-level data derived from Personal Information that is stripped of personal identifiers, such as your name, contact information, or demographic information, but still retaining details about your interactions with the Services. De-Identified Data allows us to conduct broad research and analysis while

protecting your privacy. We may combine De-Identified Data to create aggregated data, which is data that describes individuals as a group and is used for research, compiling statistics, and reporting trends, among other purposes (“**Aggregated Data**”). We may use De-Identified Data and Aggregated Data for our lawful business purposes, including improving our Services, conducting research, and promoting our business. We will not attempt to re-identify De-Identified Data or Aggregated Data. For more information about how we use De-Identified Data and Aggregated Data, please visit our [Privacy Policy](#).

## 6. How We Disclose Your Consumer Health Data

We disclose your Consumer Health Data as reasonably necessary to third parties, including:

- **AI Service Providers.** We disclose your Consumer Health Data to our AI Service Providers who process Consumer Health Data you share with us during your AI therapy sessions.
- **Website Analytics Providers.** We may use your Consumer Health Data to develop and improve the Site’s functionality, to evaluate user needs and troubleshoot problems with the Site.
- **Marketing and Advertising Partners.** With your consent, we may use your Consumer Health Data to serve targeted advertising to you, communicate with you about our Services including notifying you of new Services, and enhance our marketing capabilities.
- **Government Entities.** We may disclose your Consumer Health Data to government entities, including law enforcement, or other parties to meet certain legal requirements and enforce legal terms, including complying with a valid legal process.
- **Parties to Business Transaction.** Your Consumer Health Data may be transferred to a third party if we undergo a merger, acquisition, bankruptcy or other transaction in which that third party assumes control of our business in whole or in part.
- **Other Parties.** We may disclose your Consumer Health Data to other parties to whom you have explicitly given us consent to do so.

## 7. My Consumer Health Data Rights

Washington, Connecticut, and Nevada residents may have the following rights, subject to verification, exceptions, and limitations:

- **Right to Confirm/Access/Know**

Up to twice annually, you have the right to (a) confirm whether we are collecting, sharing, or selling your Consumer Health Data, and (b) access such Consumer Health Data. Washington residents may request a list of third parties with whom we have shared or sold Consumer Health Data and an active email address or other online mechanism that you may use to contact these third parties.

- **Right to Request Deletion**

You have the right to request deletion of your Consumer Health Data held by us and third parties. We will comply with such requests, subject to certain exceptions permitted by applicable law.

- **Right to Withdraw Your Consent/Opt-Out**

You may withdraw any consent you have provided for the Selling or Sharing of your Consumer Health Data at any time.

Connecticut residents may direct us to cease processing their Consumer Health Data for targeted advertising or “selling” their Consumer Health Data. We do not sell your Consumer Health Data, but we do disclose data to our analytics partners.

**Honoring Opt-out Preference Signals.** Connecticut residents may opt out of third-party Cookies on the Website by sending an opt-out preference signal, such as the Global Privacy Control (GPC) on the browsers or extensions that support such a signal. If you choose to use the GPC signal, you will need to turn it on for each supported browser or browser you use.

- **Right to Non-Discrimination**

You have the right to not to receive discriminatory treatment as a result of your exercise of your privacy rights.

- **How to Exercise Your Rights**

To exercise your rights, you must send us a request that (1) provides sufficient information to allow us to verify that you are the person about whom we have collected Consumer Health Data (such as your name and email address) and your relationship with us, and (2) describes your request in sufficient detail to allow us to understand, evaluate and respond to it. We may not respond to requests that do not meet these criteria.

## **8. APPEAL PROCESS**

If you disagree with our refusal to take action on your request to exercise your privacy rights, you have the right to ask us to reconsider. You may submit your request to us by:

**Appeal Timeframe.** Once we receive your request, we will acknowledge and start processing your request. Within 45 days of receiving your request, we will inform you in writing of any action taken or not taken in response to an appeal of your request, including a written explanation of the reasons for our decision. If you are a Washington resident and we deny your appeal, you can raise a concern or lodge a complaint by contacting the Washington State Attorney General at [www.atg.wa.gov/file-complaint](http://www.atg.wa.gov/file-complaint).

## **9. Connecticut Supplement to the Policy**

This Supplement applies to Connecticut consumers. It contains additional information as required under Connecticut law with regard to how we process Consumer Health Data of Connecticut residents.

- **Right to Correct Your Information**

You have a right to request that we correct your inaccurate Personal Information. If you request that we correct inaccurate Personal Information about you, we will use commercially reasonable efforts to correct it. If necessary, we may ask that you provide documentation showing that the information we retained is inaccurate.

- **Right to Data Portability.**

You may request a copy of the Personal Information you previously provided to us in a portable and, to the extent technically feasible, readily usable format.

## **10. Nevada Supplement to the Policy**

This Supplement applies to Nevada consumers. It contains additional information as required under Nevada law with regard to how we process Consumer Health Data of Nevada residents.

- **Purposes & Manner of Processing.**

We collect, use, process and share Consumer Health Data for the purposes and in the manners described in this Policy.

- **Review & Revision of Consumer Health Data.**

You may submit a request to review and revise your Consumer Health Data, using any of the methods set forth in our Consumer Health Data Privacy Statement. We will respond to your requests in accordance with applicable law, but in any event within 45 days after receiving your request. We have the right to extend the time for our response an additional 45 days if permitted under applicable law.

- **Third Party Collection of Consumer Health Data.**

We may collect Consumer Health Data, such as Internet, browser, device or other electronic network activity information. For more information about the types of Internet and network activity information we collect, please see our [Privacy Policy](#).

- **Changes to this Supplement.**

We will notify you before making any changes to our privacy practices with respect to your Consumer Health Data by posting an updated notice on this Consumer Health Data Privacy Statement and updating the effective date.
